Guernsey Police deployed additional officers to Alderney last week as the island celebrated its annual carnival.

Taking place between the 3rd and 10th August, Alderney week sees the island's population double – requiring more police officers than usual to ensure public safety. In total an extra five officers were sent for the week – on top of the three officers usually deployed in Alderney.

Inspector Andy Whitton has been leading the team and said:
