Bailiwick Law Enforcement is encouraging islanders to take part in a free, award-winning online counter terrorism training course.

Devised by counter terrorism officers and security experts, the ACT Awareness eLearning package has been made available to the public for the first time.

Counter Terrorism Policing has decided to open the training to anyone who wants to become a CT Citizen so they can learn how to spot the signs of suspicious behaviour and understand what to do in the event of a major incident.

Protect and Prepare lead for Guernsey Police, Chief Inspector J-P Le Breton said: "I recommend and support this national Action Counters Terrorism online training course package. It is equally applicable and relevant for the Bailiwick of Guernsey and the Channel Islands as it is nationally. While we are very fortunate to have not experienced a terrorist attack, the threat assessment equally applies to Crown dependencies and we should and must not be complacent due to the fortunate secure and safe environment in which we live.

"In order to keep it this way, Bailiwick Law Enforcement need the help of the community to tackle crime and terrorism, this is a great way for individuals and local businesses to contribute and upskill, gaining awareness and knowledge that can help protect others whether here or abroad. The majority of the community travel to the UK and abroad for leisure and business purposes and therefore this is relevant to all of us and part of the wider contribution to fighting terrorism."
